

# Member feedback: Beyond The Hills

#### **'Excellent':** 6 votes

- Accidents have multiple causes. In this case, the accident revealed the risk factors in a very
  closed world view, coupled with desperation. One to make us think: who do I know who
  might be forced into a corner like that?
- A great portrayal of the clash of civilisations and why the 21<sup>st</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> Centuries cannot coexist.
- Illustrates (illuminates?) a very real problem, which will increasingly need to be addressed by the rising generations of today.
- Great cinema!
- Passed the seat test. I was spellbound. This is real tragedy in the Jean Anouilh mould. In "One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest", most of the patients were also free to leave. But this had two desperately reluctant Nurse Rachets (unless the real culprit was Voichita? But she may also have been The Chief). Marlowe's Doctor Faustus was more of a tragi-comedy, but I'm minded of the penultimate line: "I cry up to my God who pulls me down?"

### 'Very Good': 11 votes

- Wonderful cinematography. Avoids the hysteria normally associated with films dealing with exorcisms (whether told from the aspect of true possession or innocent victim at the hands of religious zealots).
- The film did not seem as long as it was. It drew you in and was totally absorbing. You gradually became aware of parallels, but the most striking aspect was the clash of two worlds.
