

18 people responded. The breakdown and comments are listed below.

'Excellent': 9 votes

- Although "Death of a Salesman" would seem an unlikely choice of play for an Iranian/Muslim troupe (e.g. the Secretary Willy in the play was having an affair with emerging from the bathroom in a raincoat rather than a towel), the parallels between this and Farhadi's original screenplay (which was written before he'd discovered Arthur Miller) are remarkable. As with A Separation, the themes of how Self-Righteousness and Revenge can irretrievably destroy relationships is universal.
- A great film and beautifully acted. The rape destroyed everyone.
- I was immersed all the way through. Beautifully acted.
- A brilliant film about the problems of revenge. The best film of the season.
